

## **Former County Commissioner and Police Officer, Dave Brady Running for Douglas County Sheriff**

Dave Brady has announced his candidacy for sheriff, citing the need for experienced leadership, with a fresh perspective in the sheriff's office. With the retirement of the current sheriff next year, this presents the perfect opportunity to address some issues centered on the high attrition rate of employees within the department, and the escalating drug problem within the County.

Dave Brady and his wife Mary have been Nevada residents for the past 32 years, having raised their five children in Douglas County. Dave brings 25 years of law enforcement experience to the position, having served as a police officer in Southern California, a financial investigator for the Nevada Gaming Control Board, and as a reserve deputy sheriff for Douglas County.

Additionally, Dave's public service in Douglas County includes serving as a school board trustee for 9 years, and as a county commissioner for 6 years, following his appointment to the position by then Governor, Kenny Guinn.

Dave is a Certified Financial Planner. The financial expertise he obtained in the private sector contributed to his success in helping manage the fiscal affairs of the county as a commissioner.

Dave will bring to the sheriff's office a broad based background, having served in both the public and private sector. His education includes a Bachelor of Science degree in Public Affairs, as well as a Master of Public Administration degree, both from the University of Southern California.

Considering the dramatic changes that are occurring within the law enforcement community nationwide, Dave believes his street level experience, coupled with his executive level leadership background, provide the necessary skill sets for protecting the safety and welfare of Douglas County community and its citizens, as well as the members of the Sheriff's office who serve and protect us all.
